
CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



HONOR GUARD FUNERALS FOR IRAQ VETERANS

On April 1st, at 12:30 PM, members of the TLSC, were at Forest Park East, for the funeral of Sgt. Gregory Unruh. Sgt. Unruh was killed in action in Iraq. Members of the Patriot Guard Motorcycle Riders, presented the American Flag, the Gold Star Mother's Flag and the Blue Star flag. The service at the Chapel and grave site was very moving.

On April 8th, at 12:00, members of the TLSC Honor Guard, attended the funeral of Cpl. Joshua Alexander Molina, at Houston National Cemetery. Cpl. Molina was killed in action in Iraq. The Army Burial Team did the Honor of folding the flag and presenting it to the family. They also fired the 21-gun salute and played Taps.

Later in the day, April 8th, at 2:00 pm, several members of the TLSC attended the funeral of Cpl. Steven Candelo, at Forest Park West. Cpl. Candelo was killed in action in Iraq. After the ceremony in the chapel, the Honor Guard escorted the Horse Drawn Caisson to the Burial Site.

The Patriot Guard Rider group made an impressive appearance at all three funerals.

Howard Nathan was elected as the new Board Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Lone Star Chapter, after Jim Duncan resigned. *Congratulations Howard!*

M.I.A.'s FROM KOREA IDENTIFIED

The Dept of Defense POW/MIA office announced that the remains of two U.S. servicemen, missing from the Korean War, have been identified and will be returned to their families for burial with full military honors.

They are Cpl. Robert L. Mason of Parkersburg, W.Va.; and Pfc. Joseph K. Meyer, Jr., of Wahpeton, N.D., both U.S. Army. Both men will be buried Saturday, May 3rd. Mason will be buried in Belpre, Ohio and Meyer will be buried in Wahpeton.

Mason was assigned to B Company, 32nd Infantry Regiment, and Meyer was assigned to K Company, 31st Infantry Regiment. Both were attached to the 31st Regimental Combat Team (RCT), 7th Infantry Division. The team was engaged against the Chinese People's Volunteer Forces near the Chosin Reservoir, North Korea from late November to early December, 1950. Both men died as result of intense enemy fire, and their bodies were not recovered at the time

The remains were recovered between 2001—2005 with joint U.S. & Democratic People's Republic of Korea teams. Remains recovered led to the identification of several individuals, including Mason & Meyer.
