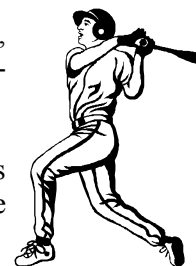


Happy St. Valentines Day

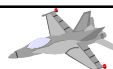

POW/MIA BRIEFING

On Saturday, January 12th, the Department Of Defense held a briefing on the status of the POW/MIA's at the Doubletree Hotel at Houston Intercontinental. Two of our members attended this meeting, David & Frances Velasco. David's older brother Frank, was listed as MIA in 1950 at the Chosin. Remains have been recovered from the same area and returned to the family. David and Frances hope and pray that Frank's remains will soon be found and returned.

The Houston Chronicle featured them in an article on the front page of the City & State section on Sunday.

The family members, from across Texas and several surrounding states, represented missing personnel from WWII, the Korean and Vietnam Wars and the Cold War. Although it has been decades since the men disappeared, new DNA technology has given their relatives reason to believe they may still be found. The new technology is mitochondrial DNA, used to identify old remains. This is inherited only maternally, family members related to the serviceman's mother, such as his siblings, are the best sources. Samples from the missing person's children would not contain his mitochondrial DNA.

how as a young S. Korean, he was raised under the Japanese occupation, and how they were required to learn Japanese. Then came the invasion of S. Korea by N. Korea and how his family lived underground. A cousin left the safety and was captured by the N. Koreans, but later escaped. It was a very interesting and informative talk. Johnney related how he helped the Americans during the war. He worked with the 8th Army as a mess-hall server and helped in any way he could. He traveled back and forth daily, between base camp Munsan to Panmunjom. He had no rank as he was a 17 year old civilian, and in the civilian service. Henry told of his early involvement in Korea before the war, being transferred to Japan, then back to Korea when the invasion began. Lee's involvement started with Operation Killer. Lee & Henry filled in the gaps between their involvement with details of the war so the students could get a full picture of the Korean War.

The students and teachers really appreciated our presence.
